What is the PADI Rescue Diver Course?

This course will expand your knowledge and experience level. Rescue Divers learn to look beyond themselves and consider the safety and well being of other divers. Although this course is challenging it is a rewarding way to build your confidence as a diver.

What Do I Need to Know Before I start?

- You must be a certified Advanced Open Water Diver.
- E.F.R Certification or equivalent First Aid/CPR (within 24 mos.)
- Proof of 20 logged dives by course completion.



When & Where Do the Classes Meet?

- Course will be independently scheduled.
- Knowledge development done through E-Learning
- Confined water skills will take place at our location.
- Open water dives will be done at Lake Pueblo

What Diving Equipment Will I Need?

- You are responsible for any and all necessary scuba equipment needed for the training.
- Tanks and weights will be provided.

What Will I Be Doing?

The Rescue Diver Course prepares you to help prevent, and manage dive emergencies, with a variety of techniques.



How Long Does it Take? What Will I Need?

- EFR course (if needed) 8-10 hours
- Rescue Diver course 20-24 hours.

- EFR manual and DVD** (if needed)
- All scuba equipment including compass, signaling device, timing device and depth gauge or computer, knife, and pocket mask.
